

## Support Services for Student Athletes

- **Financial Aid**

Many sources of financial aid are available to students with financial need. In addition, the college also awards loans, which are not determined by financial need, and scholarships based on merit and achievement. Please apply for financial aid early to maximize your chances of receiving aid. Applications are available in January for students who will be attending classes beginning in the following Fall semester.

- **Counseling**

The Counseling Division staff provides a friendly, relaxed and confidential environment for you to discuss academic, personal, social or career issues and concerns. Students often talk to counselors about how to improve study skills, or how to deal with relationship issues, or concerns about anxiety or depression, as well as learning about using career inventories to select a major. The counseling staff also has information about a variety of community services and agencies and can help locate and refer you to these community resources. Counselors are available M-R 8:00am – 7:00pm and F 8:00am – 5:00pm. Located in the Kranitz Student Center (KSC-187).

- **Library**

The library, located in the Learning Resources Complex: Building "E" (E-102), supports learning through its instruction program, reference assistance and collection. Library instruction sessions are designed for students to learn the best approach to researching information for classes as well as personal pursuits. Library faculty are also available in the library, as well as 24/7 online, to assist with individual research. The library's collection consists of books, DVDs, videotapes,

CDs, audiotapes, journals, magazines and newspapers. In addition, the library provides access to various electronic as well as the Internet. There are individual and group study rooms, media viewing equipment and copy machines. For further information, call (602) 787-7200.

- **Computer Commons**

The Computer Commons, located in the Learning Resources Complex Bldg (E-137), provides support for PVCC student to complete PVCC course or campus related assignments. Students may use the computer lab on campus by registering for a non-credit computer lab section (NC 500/ 0001) and paying a \$15.00/ semester fee. A PVCC current student ID is required to use the lab. Also, students will need to complete a brief orientation on their first visit to the Commons.

- **PVCC Media Services**

PVCC Media Services provides advice and equipment support for student presentation use in the classroom. Production materials are available at student prices for overhead transparencies, posters, VHS tapes, DVDs and lamination. Students can feel free to go to Media Services and talk with one of the staff about a presentation or media need.

- **Learning Support Center**

The LSC offers free tutoring and other learning support programs and services. Programs include the Math Lab, Language Lab, ESL conversation groups, and the Writing Center. Learning resources include videotapes, DVDs, CDs, science models, software, solution manuals, handouts and online access to FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions).

You will also find study improvement materials in the areas of note taking, test taking, time management, vocabulary, reading textbooks, learning how to learn, and many others.

The PASS Program is housed in the LSC study group rooms.

### **General Campus Information**

- **Photo Identification Cards**

All students are encouraged to obtain and carry a PVCC Photo ID Card while on campus. You may obtain your Photo ID card at the College Safety Office (KSC-126). This card is free and is also used in the Library, Fitness Center, Learning Support Center and Computer Labs. A \$5.00 fee is charged to replace lost cards.

- **Parking Decals**

All students who drive motor vehicles on the PVCC campus are required to register the vehicle with the College Safety Office (KSC-126). Parking stickers are free. You must know your vehicle license number to obtain a parking decal.
