The Children's Center at PVCC offers a developmentally appropriate early care and education program for children of students enrolled in classes on campus. The Center is licensed by Arizona Department of Health Services and accepts DES subsidies for qualifying families. The program enrolls children with independent toileting skills who have reached their third birthday by August 31st of the current academic year. Children may attend through the end of their kindergarten year or age six, whichever occurs earlier. Our early childhood program is accredited by The National Academy of Early Childhood Programs, a division of the National Association for the Education of Young Children. No preschool is provided during winter break. Spring Semester 2008 Preschool services resume on the first day of classes for PVCC students in January, 2008.

Students who have a GPA of 3.25 or above, based on at least 12 hours of 100 level or higher course work at any MCCC college, can submit an application to the Honors Coordinator for a Fee Waiver Scholarship. In conjunction, the student must also enroll in 6 credit hours or more per semester including at least one Honors course.

To be eligible for an Honors Presidents' Scholarship, a student must be within one academic year following graduation from an a North Central Association (NCA) accredited high school in Maricopa County. The student must rank in the top 15% of the class at the end of their 6th, 7th, or 8th semester (official transcript required) or may test into the scholarship by obtaining high test scores on the math, reading and writing assessment tests. Students must not enroll in any other post-secondary institution between high school graduation and first enrollment at MCCC. The Presidents' Scholarship is renewable for up to four consecutive regular semesters as long as the student maintains eligibility.

Math Lab: PV students enrolled in MAT081/MAT082 (Basic Arithmetic) and MAT091/MAT092 (Introductory Algebra) work with tutors who support many different approaches to learning math.
