Please read the following and use the workshop slides to help the student in this section problem solve for success.

A Student's Story

A student is enrolled in nine (9) credit hours in the fall term and six (6) credit hours in the spring term. In the fall the student withdrew from three (3) credit hours and in the spring they withdrew from three credit hours and received a failing grade also worth three (3) credit hours. The evaluation period for Satisfactory Academic Progress for this student is the fall & spring terms.

During the academic year (evaluation period) the student received approximately \$3,000.00 in federal Pell Grant funding and \$7,000.00 in Federal Direct Student Loans.

In the fall the student withdrew from the class because they were not passing and did not want to bring down their grade point average (GPA). In the spring the student withdrew from class because, 1) the class was too difficult, 2) the class did not count towards their degree program and 3) they only took the class to get a federal student loan which requires that a student be enrolled in six credit hours. The student said that they failed the other spring class because the first class took too much of their time. They also truly believed that they were passing the class. It was not until they received their most recent test back with a failing grade. The professor wrote a note that suggested that the student come to see her regarding the student's progress. The student said that time was very important because they worked and had family responsibilities.

Like many student, this student came into the college with goals and dreams to improve their lives through education. Now the student is afraid that they might lose their financial aid funding and never get to realize their goals. The student is not sure what to do and is thinking about just leaving campus and not returning in the following fall. The student knows that there is another college nearby and is thinking of enrolling in the other college in the fall. The student is hoping that their past academic history will not follow them to the other college.
