All courses must be transferable to ASU West. *Students are advised to take all courses in a classroom setting, following the sequence listed above.*

Admission to the ASU WEST Professional Teacher Preparation Program (PTPP) requires a minimum of 56 credits. However, completion of 60-64 credits is highly recommended so students can devote the time and effort necessary to successfully complete the PTPP blocks in four semesters. All prospective transfer students to the PTPP must attend a College of Education Orientation prior to application to the program.
