

Vocabulary Card Study Method

On the front side of the index card, underline the vocabulary word in a sentence you found it in:

“The old church stood on the corner of Main and Maple streets,
a **venerable** reminder of the town's long history.”

(If the example sentence is not from *World of Words*,
then indicate where you found it.) → from To Kill a Mockingbird, page 4.

To test yourself, look at this side of the card and pronounce the word, say the part of speech and define it. Then turn the card over to see if you are correct.

On the back side of the card write down 4 things:

- The dictionary spelling
- The word's pronunciation
- The part of speech

ven•er•a•ble (ven'-ur-ə-bəl') *adj.*
